## 3 Time & Skill Level

- Magic ring, 6 sc (6 stitches).
- Round 2: 2 sc in each stitch (12).
- Rounds 3–8: Increase gradually to 36 stitches, then work even for 4 rounds.
- Rounds 13–18: Decrease to 12 stitches, stuff firmly.
- **Tip:** Use a stitch marker to track the start of each round. Check stitch count after Round 5 to avoid errors.
- **Customization:** Add a slightly larger head for a cartoonish Dobby by increasing to 42 stitches.

## 4.2 Step 2: Body

- **Yarn:** Same as head.
- **Pattern:**
  - Start with 6 sc in a magic ring.
  - Increase to 24 stitches over 4 rounds.
  - Work even for 10 rounds, then decrease to 12.
  - Stuff lightly for a slender frame.
- **Tip:** Keep tension consistent to avoid a lumpy body. Crochet loosely for easier stuffing.
- **Customization:** Extend the body by 2 rounds for a taller Dobby.

## 4.3 Step 3: Arms & Legs (Make 4)

- **Yarn:** Light gray or beige.
- **Pattern:**
  - Magic ring, 5 sc (5).
  - Increase to 10 stitches, work even for 8 rounds.
  - Decrease slightly, stuff lightly, and close.
- **Tip:** Understuff arms and legs for a floppy, ragdoll effect.
- **Customization:** Add finger details with embroidery for realism.

## 4.4 Step 4: Ears (Make 2)

- **Yarn:** Light gray or beige.
- **Pattern:**
  - Chain 8, sc across, turn.
  - Work 6 rows, decreasing at edges for a pointed shape.
  - Fold and sew to head at Round 8.

- **Tip:** Starch ears lightly for structure.
- **Customization:** Use a slightly darker yarn for a weathered look.

#### 4.5 Step 5: Eyes & Facial Details

- **Materials:** Safety eyes or black embroidery floss.
- **Pattern:**
  - Place eyes between Rounds 9–10, 6 stitches apart.
  - Embroider a small nose and mouth with brown yarn.
- **Tip:** Practice eye placement on scrap yarn to get Dobbys expressive look right.
- **Customization:** Add white felt behind eyes for a glowing effect.

#### 4.6 Step 6: Tattered Cloth

- **Yarn:** White or off-white scrap yarn.
- **Pattern:**
  - Chain 20, sc across for 10 rows.
  - Fray edges with scissors for a worn look.
  - Wrap around body and stitch loosely.
- **Tip:** Use a lighter-weight yarn for a delicate cloth.
- **Customization:** Add patches with colorful yarn scraps.
